- 1) the rule of Darius,
- 2) the rule of Philadelphus,
- 3) the beginning of the Callippic periods,
- the death of Alexander (it is usually assumed that here Ptolemy means Alexander of Macedonia, but Ptolemy really speaks simply about some "Alexander"),
- 5) the beginning of the Chaldean era,
- 6) the beginning of the era of Dionysius,
- 7) the rule of Augustus,
- 8) the rule of Domitian,
- 9) the rule of Trajan,
- 10) the rule of Hadrian,
- 11) the rule of Antoninus.

For all these events, we automatically obtain the following dates (the time intervals are considered with an accuracy of 5 years):

0)	the beginning of the era of Nabonassar:	460-490 A.D.,
1)	the rule of Darius:	685–715 A.D.,
2)	the rule of Philadelphus:	840-885 A.D.,
3)	the beginning of the Callippic periods:	875-910 A.D.,
